<u>Update of the Development Control statistics</u>

The Area Manager (West) presented graphs of the development control statistics. He explained there were no outstanding Decision Notices to be issued this month but there was a backlog in terms of registration of applications due to the break down of the scanner. Once this is operational DC Officers will be concentrating on validating applications when our performance in terms of the 8 weeks period will improve.

Our PS1 and PS2 forms for the last quarter have been returned to WAG and we are running at 43%. There are 240 applications not determined and 38 Section 106 Agreements to be completed.

Validation Best Practice will be introduced in September and we are in the process of preparing a press release to advise members of the public.

<u>P21455 – Update on progress regarding Priory Church in Wales Primary School,</u> Pendre, Brecon

Since the last meeting, the Area Planning Manager (West) has discussed various issues with the agent and was pleased to report they fully accept the material (treated zinc) for the roof. They are considering a ground source heating system with a back up of gas, but they will report back to us on this.

They are more than happy to provide solar panels for the heating system which will be incorporated in the roof. The agents however are reluctant to agree until they have confirmation of funding.

A full report for Members will be brought back to the September covering all the issues. Members will also be provided with samples of the roofing system.

New Development Control Report

The Area Planning Manager (West) provided Members with a copy of the suggested new planning report. A lot of work had gone into preparing the new format and layout of the report and the opportunity to show a larger scale plan was now available with the new system. For the future a scale map of 1:1250 would be used in urban areas whereas a scale of 1:2500 would be used in rural areas to show the relationship of the application site to other settlements.

Members had previously asked for a key map, but Officers informed them there were technical difficulties with the system to produce these. It was also hoped that there would be enough room on the CD Rom to include the plans relevant to the agenda item but this has not been tested yet. There will be further improvements at some stage but the key thing is the running order.

Members were concerned with the scale of the application site shown in conjunction to other settlements. They also referred to the planning history and wished the date and decision to be added to the report.

<u>Section 1 – Reports seeking authority to take enforcement action</u>

<u>ENF3749 – Alleged breach – Non return of a Section 16 requisition for information notice and the unauthorised alteration of a Listed Building (Grade II) – 62 The Struet, Brecon</u>

Decision: Deferred

<u>ENF 3786 – Alleged breach – Alleged unauthorised siting of static caravan – Land adjacent to New Rank Cottages, Llanelly Hill</u>

<u>Decision:</u> That authority be granted to take formal enforcement action requiring the removal of the unauthorised static caravan and associated paraphernalia from the site.

<u>ENF3895 – Alleged breach – Operating taxi business from residential garage – 16 orchard Street and adjacent car park, Llanfaes, Brecon</u>

<u>Decision:</u> That authority be granted to issue an enforcement notice requiring the removal of the unauthorised aerial and the cessation of use of the dwelling as a taxi business.

<u>ENF4064 – Alleged breach – Site of visual detriment – Land to the rear of The Forge, Govilon, Monmouthshire</u>

<u>Decision:</u> That authority be granted to issue a formal notice under the provisions of Section 215 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990/91 requiring the removal of the materials stored upon the land which is detrimental to the amenities of the area.

<u>ENF4071 – Alleged breach – Unauthorised security shutters on windows of a Grade</u> II Listed Building – The Beaufort Arms, Beaufort Street, Crickhowell, Powys

<u>Decision:</u> That authority be granted to issue an enforcement notice requiring the removal of the security shutters and the repair of any damage caused by fixing these shutters to the property.
